Fibrositis

Introduction

Fibrositis is a misnomer for a very common form of nonarticular rheumatism. The name implies an inflammatory process in fibroconnective tissue which has never been verified. Fibrositis (fibromyalgia) is a common disorder, but is often not considered or diagnosed by clinicians.

Definition

Fibrositis is defined as pain and inflammation of the muscle, muscle sheath and connective tissue layers of the bone, muscle, tendons and joints. Also called **Fibromyalgia**.

Symptoms

- Ill-defined musculoskeletal pain
- Local tenderness
- Aggravating factors are stress, cold, noise and unaccustomed exercise;
- Depression,
- Nonrestorative sleep,
- Chronic fatigue
- Early morning stiffness.

On examination

• Physical examination revels normal, apart from painful tender spots which are remarkably consistent in location from patient to patient.

Treatment

- Drug therapy alone is seldom effective in alleviating symptoms;
- A carefully planned education program is necessary to readjust both psyche and soma.
- Stretching exercises can also be useful in treatment.
